Maureen A. **Taylor** is an internationally recognized expert on the intersection of history, genealogy, and photography. She has been featured in top media outlets, including *The View*, *Martha Stewart Living*, and *The Today Show*. Maureen is the author of a number of books and magazine articles, as well as a contributing editor at *Family Tree Magazine*. In 2007, *The Wall Street Journal* called her “the nation’s foremost historical photo detective.” Her books that she will have with her for sale and signing include: *Fashionable Folks: Hairstyles* (19.95), *Preserving Your Family Photographs* (24.99), *The Last Muster: Images of the Revolutionary War Generation* (45.00) and *Through the Eyes of Your Ancestors* (8.95).

Overlooked Research Records and How to Get the Most Out of BANQ.

(Bibliothèque et Archives nationales du Québec)

Denyse **Beaugrand-Champagne** wears two hats: one as part time reference archivist at the Montreal centre of *Bibliothèque et Archives nationales du Québec* [BANQ] where 85% of the patrons are amateur genealogists. She also runs a research business in genealogy called HISTOQUEST. Although her clients are mostly government agencies interested in heir searching, Denyse also researches for individuals from all over the world breaking down brick-wall cases about ancestors in Quebec.

Denyse has written a book about the trial of a black slave accused of setting Montreal on fire in 1734. That research was used as the basis of an award winning web site: [The Torture and the Truth. Angelique and the Burning of Montreal](#) which is part of the Great Unsolved Mysteries in Canadian History. Her book has been at the center of many educational and artistic happenings. In the coming fall a documentary on her and the story of Angelique will be broadcast on Canada French national network.
